## AN INVITATION TO CONVERSATION:



Below is a letter of invitation from Howard Friend, who has been hired as a consultant by OPC. Howard is a Presbyterian minister, congregational consultant, spiritual mentor and preacher. He was a called pastor for thirty years and an interim pastor for five. He is founder and lead consultant of the Parish Empowerment Network through which he has led

workshops and retreats for over 150 congregations and non-profit organizations in twenty-five states and four foreign countries. Howard is president of the Karitas Foundation that has led mission trips to Mexico, Nicaragua, Haiti, Jamaica and India and sponsors community-based empowerment-focused projects in several countries, a focus in Mexico. He calls himself a contemplative activist. Howard has written two books and many articles.

Dear Overbrook Church,

My name is Howard Friend. I am a congregational consultant, and the church has hired me to accompany you through this time of transition. I'd love to meet with you.

This has been quite a year and a half for your church. Maybe longer. Times of smooth sailing and times of turbulent waters. Transitions are never easy. Church leaders have invited me to invite you to sign up for forty-five-minute conversations: your thoughts and feelings, your ideas and suggestions, what's being easy and what's being difficult. I am a good listener. What we talk about will be confidential. You can come alone or with up to three others.

I will take notes during our conversations, gathering and then summarizing what you share, then preparing a report for the church's leadership. Copies of that report will be available upon request.

I plan to be here for the first of these conversations Thursday, Jan. 3, 2019, from 2 to 9 p.m. for on-the-hour 45-minute conversations. There will be a sign-up sheet at Coffee Hour, or you can call the church office to reserve a time. I'd love to have a full day.
