SHARING THE BREAD AND CUP

Communion will be received by intinction. Please come forward, as directed by the ushers, to one of the two serving stations. Take the bread, dip it into the cup, and partake. Gluten-free communion wafers are offered on each plate in a separate paper cup, as an option for those who need them.

Those in the center sections of the church will be served first. You may come forward down the center aisle, then return to your seat by the side aisles.

Then those in the side sections of the church will be served. You may come forward down the side aisles, then return to your seat by the aisles closest to the front.

Those physically unable to come forward should notify an usher, and may be served in the pew.

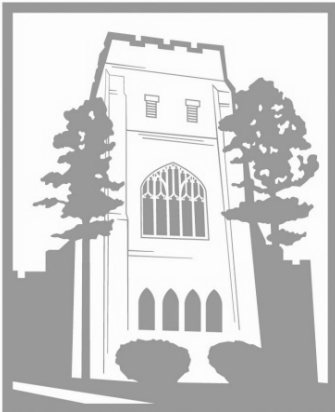
