The cover artwork is part of the tile reredos behind the high altar at the abbey of Keur Moussa, near Dakar, Senegal. Incorporating iconographic features of Western European art but depicting Biblical characters as Senegalese, this piece, which represents the Life of Mary, was created in 1963 by Father Georges Saget, a monk from the French abbey of Solesmes who helped found this monastery. The monks engage primarily in agricultural work, but they also have produced several recordings of their liturgical music, which blends Gregorian chant with West African rhythms and instruments; one such instrument, the kora, is an African lute-harp, taught to the first monks at Keur Moussa by nomadic musicians and storytellers.
