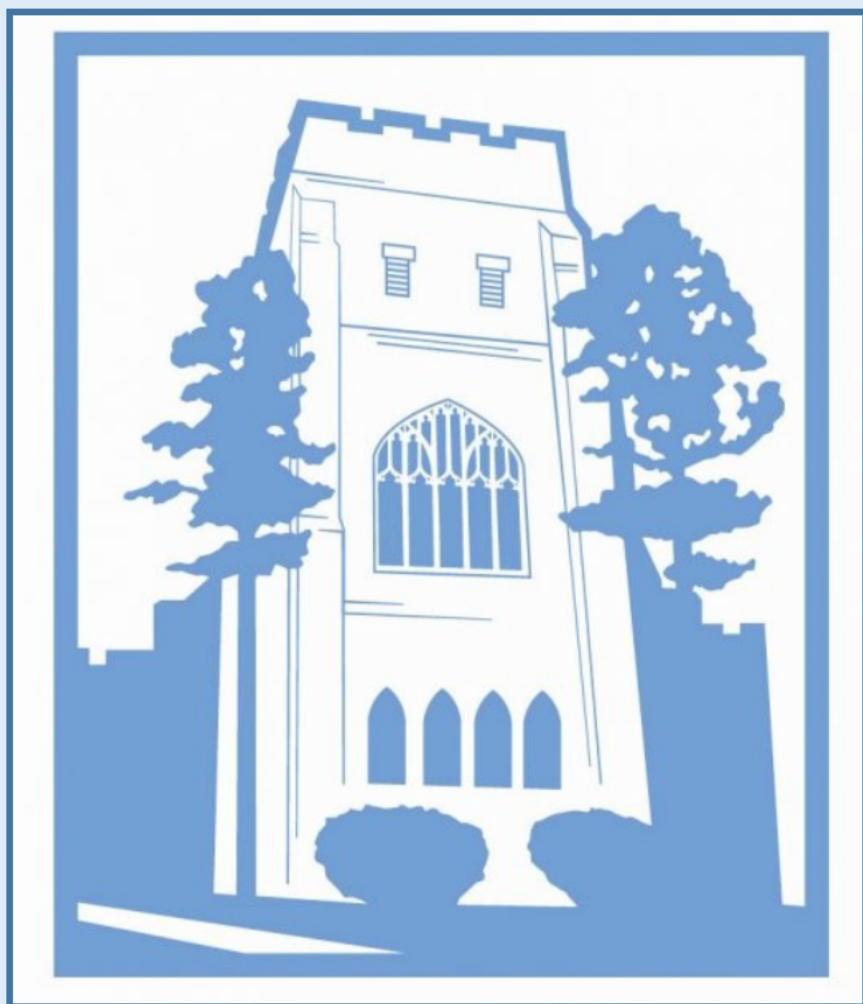

All are invited to participate in a morning of service activities in honor of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. On January 16, from 9:00-11:30 AM, Fellowship Hall, the Wistar Morris Room, the Chapel and the Kitchen will be filled with opportunities for our OPC hands to do God's work. Participants will meet in the Wistar Morris Room at 9:00 AM for a litany in remembrance of Dr. King. At 9:15 AM, we will proceed to our "service stations." There will be activities appropriate for all ages and skill levels. Activities include: A Tee-Shirt Memorial in memory of those killed by gun violence, constructing radiator covers for Sunday School rooms, cooking soup and cornbread for Aid for Friends, making lap robes for shut-ins, assembling comfort kits for families in shelters, packing breakfast bags for Aid for Friends; sewing garments for children (Dress a Girl Around the World); beautifying and restoring our church building and property.
