

Please join us in the front of our sanctuary for Service for Healing and Wholeness. Do you need healing in your life? Then join us after either worship service for a special time of prayer for individuals. What can you expect from the Service for Wholeness? Healing is a gift from

God, and only God knows how each person will be healed. Our Presbyterian Church (USA) 's Companion to the Book of Common Worship edited by Peter C. Bower explains that Jesus prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane, "Not what I want but what you want" (Matt. 26:39). God encourages us to bring our deepest concerns and our greatest fears to him. Through our prayers, we are reminded that God is in control. So, we invite you to stay for a few minutes after the worship service. Join us up front in the sanctuary. Share your concerns with others. The Book bag Project
