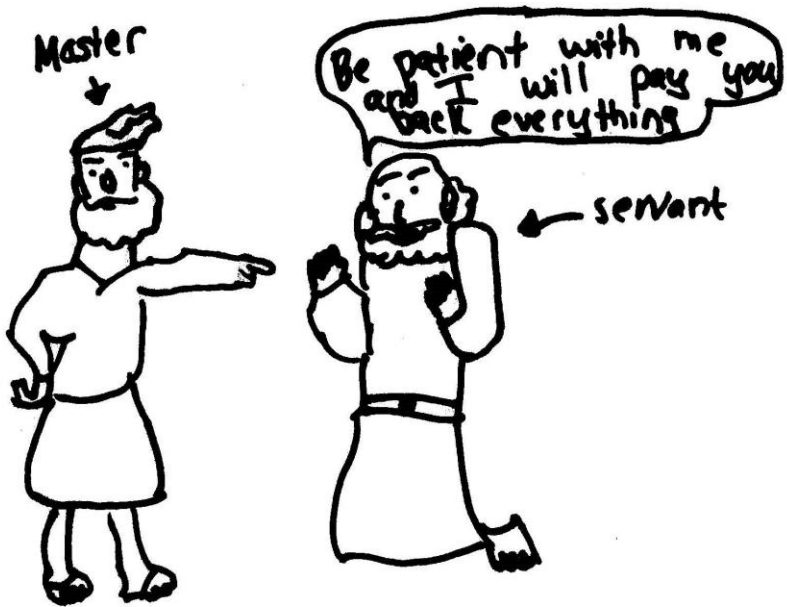

POSTLUDE

Introduction and Passacaglia in D minor

Max Reger

On its surface, the concept of the passacaglia is simple: a repeated bass line, subject to variations in the upper voices. This relatively open form allows composers to be as restrained or elaborate as they wish. Arguably the most famous passacaglia is J. S. Bach's Passacaglia in C minor, which is featured in the Disney movie *Fantasia*.

Max Reger saw his music as the continuation of German musical tradition, an heir to the rich compositional legacy of Bach. His **Introduction and Passacaglia in D minor** begins with an explosive array of sound before, very quietly, the theme in the bass is heard for the first time. Over the course of the piece, the variations get louder and more complex before a brilliant finale in D major. Be sure to listen to how the gradual buildup of sound shows off our beautiful instrument at Overbrook.

Ten Reasons to Invite Families and Friends to Worship on June 17

1) **Jesus Christ is preaching this Sunday.** While Overbrook Presbyterians and friends have heard many wonderful sermons since our this congregation was founded in 1889, none is better than the sermon by the Head of the Church. On June 17 we will hear from the one whom millions of people call Lord and Savior.

2) **This Greatest Sermon of All Time will be Preached This Sunday.** The Sermon on the Mount found in the Gospel of Matthew, chapters 5-7, is simply the best sermon ever preached. We often hear a few verses from the Bible on any Sunday. This Sunday, worshippers will hear Jesus' whole sermon, all three chapters divided into different parts, and thus get to hear its full, inspiring message in one service.

3) **This Greatest Sermon Will Be Read by the Body of Christ.** The Apostle Paul describes the Church as the Body of Christ made up of many members who all need each other (see 1 Corinthians 12:12-31). Twenty Overbrook Presbyterians, from ages 5 to 90's will take turns reading parts of the Sermon on the Mount. Different voices speak to different people in different ways. The combination of diverse voices sharing Jesus' sermon is awesome.

4) **The Holy Spirit Will Speak to Us This Sunday Morning Through the Bible.** Every Sunday we have a prayer for illumination as part of the worship service asking for God to help us hear anew what he is saying to us. Here is a popular prayer of illumination, *"Lord, open our hearts and minds by the power of your Holy Spirit, that as the Scriptures are read and your Word is proclaimed, we may hear with joy what you say to us today. Amen."* We believe God answers prayers and will again tomorrow as we hear Jesus' Sermon.

5) **This Sermon Has Changed Lives and the World Down Through History.** The Russian novelist Leo Tolstoy wrote a book, *What I Believe*, about the Sermon on the Mount. An Indian lawyer Mahatma Gandhi read Tolstoy's book and it inspired him to apply Jesus' nonviolent teachings to bring independence to the second most populated country in the world. A young German minister read Jesus' sermon and wrote his own reflections on it that were later titled *The Cost of Discipleship*; the book inspired millions after its author, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, was

killed by the Nazis. A young Baptist preacher read Jesus' sermon and news reports about Gandhi's work; Martin Luther King, Jr.'s nonviolent civil rights work changed the United States for the better for all. An electrician working Polish shipyard was inspired by Jesus' sermon and King's nonviolent work; Lech Walesa organized his fellow workers and helped to nonviolently end communism there which helped to end the Cold War. Episcopal priest Desmond Tutu followed Jesus' teachings in the Sermon on the Mount to help end oppression in South Africa.

6) **We Will Sing New Hymns Inspired by This Greatest Sermon.** Overbrook Pastor Carolyn Gillette has written four new hymns to well-known hymn tunes that are paraphrases of Jesus' teachings. One of the best ways to learn anything is to sing it; most of us can say the alphabet easily by singing it. These hymns will help us remember Jesus' teachings. Carolyn's hymns are now in more than twenty different denominational hymnals and other worship resources.

7) **More Special Music Will be Presented This Sunday.** Our Director of Music will be leading an informal hymn sing starting at 10:10 a.m. on June 17 so you can sing some of your favorite hymns. Chris will also be providing his usual outstanding organ music during the service and accompanying one of the Overbrook Quartet soloist for more exceptional music.

8) **We Will Pray for Others and Ourselves.** Every Sunday we have times in worship to pray for others (and have the option to sign prayer cards for them) and also for ourselves.

9) **We Support Christ's Work Through the Offering.** We praise God not only with our voices, but also serve him with our pocketbooks and billfolds. Our offering goes to support furthering Jesus' teaching in our church and world.

10) **The Worship Service is at Overbrook Presbyterian Church.** This is a wonderful congregation of loving Christians who warmly welcome all, joyfully worship and faithfully serve God.
