What is Apportionment? Apportionment is OPC's annual contribution to the Greater Presbytery of Mid-Atlantic USA, helping support the ministry and mission of our wider Presbyterian church family. This shared contribution is based on church membership and allows congregations to work together in ministry, accountability, and outreach. Our apportionment is calculated at **\$37.00 per official member on our church roll**. For Overbrook, the annual apportionment totals approximately \$14,400 each year. If you would like to help support this important commitment, and contribute even a portion of that \$37.00, it would ease a significant burden from our general operating budget.
