

Overflowing Generosity" - One Great Hour of Sharing 2017

Today is the day to Give with "Overflowing Generosity". We will be collecting a special offering this Sunday during worship for our One Great Hour of Sharing.

Our One Great Hour of Sharing this year will be directed to providing clean drinking water for people in Flint, Michigan and in Ghana, Africa.

Think about how easy it is for us to get a drink of water. This life-sustaining clear liquid is so abundant in our lives that we actually take showers in it! Imagine having to walk miles to a well and then *carry* home all the water your family will have for a day.

Through our "overflowing generosity" we can make clean drinking water more accessible to a community by providing for a new well, or for new systems of collecting and distributing water.

Every drop of water, when joined with others, becomes a pool, a stream, a river, and ocean. In the same way, even the smallest drop of generosity can join with others to make a huge difference for those in need of life-giving water.

Garden Well (\$50 a share or \$1500) – provides water for drinking, washing, bathing and irrigation

Sand Dam (\$500) – provides safe drinking water for an entire community

Rainwater Catchment system (\$75) – provides usable water for washing and irrigation

Water filter (\$50) – Flint Michigan – provide families with safe drinking water and keep 300 bottles out of landfills

Jerry cans (\$20) – 10 cans provide a families with an easier method of transporting water to their homes
