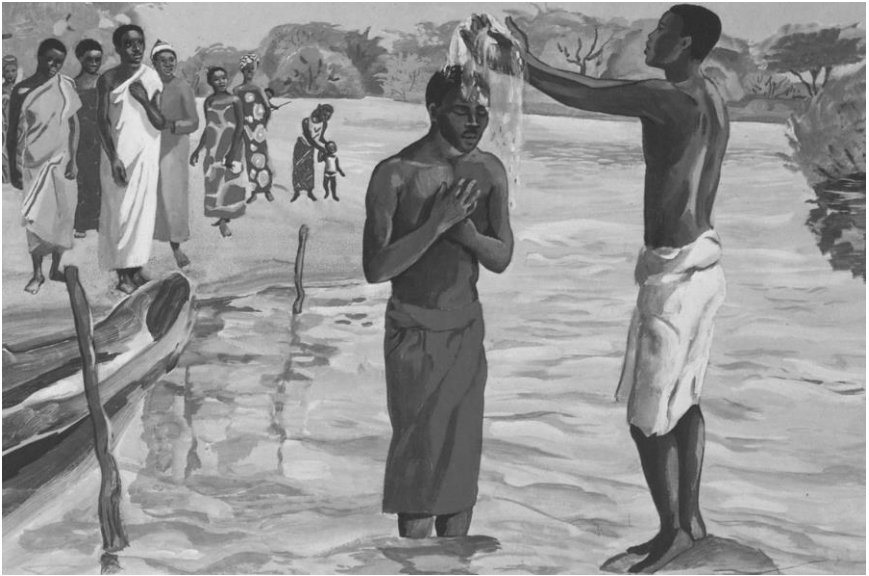

REAFFIRMATION OF THE BAPTISMAL COVENANT

Profession of Faith

❖ Renunciations

ONE: Trusting in the gracious mercy of God, do you turn from the ways of sin and renounce evil and its power in the world?

MANY: I do.

ONE: Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept Him as your Lord and Savior, trusting in His grace and love?

MANY: I do.

ONE: Will you be Christ’s faithful disciple, obeying His word and showing His love?

MANY: I will.

❖ AFFIRMATION OF FAITH- (*The Westminster Larger Catechism; 7.277*)

Q. 167. How is our Baptism to be improved by us?

A. The needful but much neglected duty of improving our Baptism, is to be performed by us all our life long,

especially in the time of temptation,

and when we are present at the administration of it to others,

by serious and thankful consideration of the nature of it

and of the ends for which Christ instituted it,

the privileges and benefits conferred and sealed thereby,

and our solemn vow made therein;

by being humbled for our sinful defilement,

our falling short of, and walking contrary to,
the grace of Baptism and our engagements;
by growing up to assurance of pardon of sin,
and of all other blessings sealed to us in that sacrament;
by drawing strength from the death and resurrection of Christ,
into whom we are baptized,
for the mortifying of sin, and quickening of grace;
and by endeavoring to live by faith,
to have our conversation in holiness and righteousness,
as those that have therein given up their names to Christ,
and to walk in brotherly love,
as being baptized by the same Spirit into one body.
