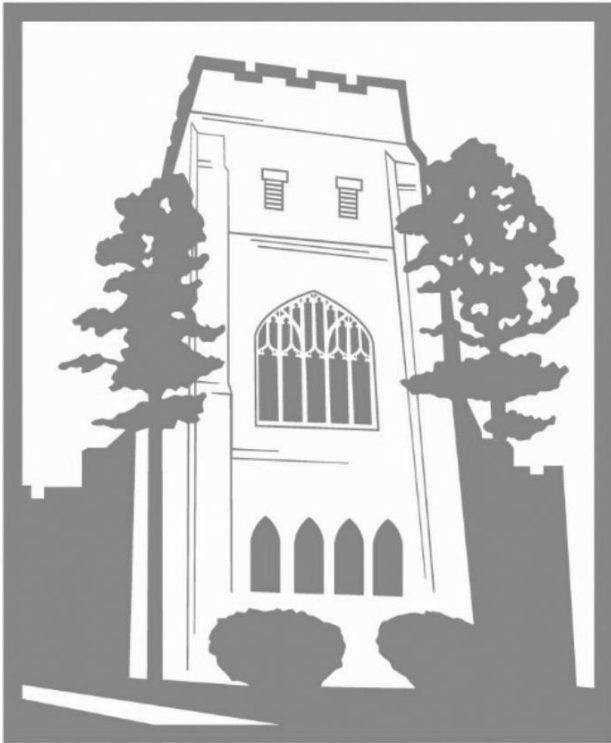

Upper grades classes will meet on the second floor of Fellowship Hall and in the Chapel. Classes begin at approximately 11:15 and extend until noon.
