NEWS FROM THE CROSSROADS

Overbrook Presbyterian Church

In this season of displacement and discernment, the church is beginning to dream about what our church building will become. This discernment process begins with reaffirming our core values: Welcome, Love, and Transformation. Each decision about our building begins with asking, "How will this allow us to better live into our core values?" As we seek answers to these questions, we are asking the congregation to send us their dreams for the building, and by extension the dreams for the mission and ministry of the church. To this end, we are asking people to answer these two questions:

- 1. What can we do to the building to allow you to do more faithful ministry?
- 2. What can we do to the building to better serve you and your faith?

These two questions are related. One asks how the building will make you a better minister, and one asks how the building will minister to you. How will the building help you give, and how will it help you receive? Christian discipleship requires living in the tension of giving and receiving God's gifts. Our building is a gift, and in this season, we hope to increase the value of that gift as it serves our congregation and as we use it to serve the world.

The answers to these questions will allow us to form the necessary task forces to ensure the building best serves our ministry. We will begin organizing more conversations about the building and its needs. We will provide various ways to participate in dreaming about what is next, including small group conversations.



Gratitude to Our Guides: Journey to the Heart Children's Sunday School

Children and adults have been led on a *Journey to the Heart* during their Lenten Sunday School sessions. As a contemplative prayer curriculum, *Journey to the Heart* invited learners to experience the Holy Spirit's presence and action within; a subtle movement we learn to discern over time. As an experiential learning curriculum, our *Journey* introduced a new prayer tool each week while rooting learners in a foundational practice, Centering Prayer. Over the course of our journey together, over **30 children** were exposed to Centering Prayer (six minutes, using a sacred word). Learners also encountered Viseo and Lectio Divina, Breath and Body Prayers, and various developmentally tailored spiritual tools to aid in *practicing the presence of God*.



Our safe passage on this journey is the result of months of dreaming and intentional planning by dozens of individuals, as well as an incredible degree of connection fostered between children and adults over the past several years. First, the CFM wishes to extend gratitude to Virginia Jennings whose rich yoga and music session on March 10th got everyone's hearts and bodies moving! We also lift up the incredible Anne Montgomery Schmidt of *Encircled Grace* for her ministry of Labyrinth facilitation and teaching throughout our worship, education, and fellowship on March 17th. Next, a HUGE thanks to Sunday School Teachers Molly Burke, Emily Stewart, Davorka Sabljak, Donna Bell Koon, Carol Rozmiarek, and Anne Foote; these leaders lean into a brilliant critical pedagogy when performing their work and serve as valuable models to our children.

Finally, we ask the congregation to join us in celebrating the amazing, open, and Spirit-filled children of OPC! Our children's earnestness, curiosity, and enthusiastic responses to prayer inspires all of us to lead an increasingly holistic and experiential Christian Education environment for all ages at the crossroads.
