If you had come into my office in the 25 years preceding my retirement, you would have seen a fish tank in the corner of the room. Fish tanks have always had a soothing effect on me for some reason. But it also had a practical function in my office. I found that if someone wanted to stop by to talk and if they had children with them, that the fish tank would have a salubrious effect on the behavior of those children. Most of the time the fish tank gave us time to talk because the children were drawn to the color and motion and novelty of the tank and its occupants.

It had the same effect on me. I often would take a break, grab a cup of coffee, and pull my chair over to the tank and just watch, clearing my mind and allowing myself to be drawn into the watery world that I had created.

I was the reason that tank existed. I maintained it. I fed the fish, changed the water, made sure that the water was oxygenated, kept it at the appropriate temperature, made sure that the chemistry of the water was balanced, and I cleaned it when needed. It was my little world.

Without me, the fish would have suffered and died.

They did not have ultimate control over their lives, really. If I tired of them, they were done. If I did not feed them, they starved. If I did not change the water, they would sicken. If I was negligent, they would suffer. And eventually would have died. They chose the direction of their movements, but they owed their lives to me.

Now, they could have wreaked havoc in that fish tank if they had wanted. The sharks could have eaten the neons or wagtails. The larger fish could have harassed the small ones. So, no matter how well I had cared for the tank, if my creation had opted for bedlam it would have happened. I could have *made* it so that bedlam would never have happened, but I liked the diversity and balance that I had struck in that little world. It was *my* world; it was entirely dependent on me. But its inhabitants had the freedom to either enjoy or destroy their little world, depending upon their inclination.

Sounds familiar, does it not! We live in God's world, and have all we need. We are dependent upon God. We can enjoy or destroy, depending upon our moods or passions at the moment.

If we opt for the balance God intended, by God's help, there is enough for all, and a blessed life for all. God's balance is good. What we do with it is everything.
