Merry Christmas!

Yes, it is January. And remember, the song “The Twelve Days of Christmas” reminds us this liturgical season of Christmastide is twelve days long, and stretches until January 6 – the feast of Epiphany! So again, Merry Christmas!

January will begin an exciting new opportunity for all people to learn and worship together. Christian Education will begin Sunday mornings at 9:15 a.m. for all ages (3 – 103). At 9:15 each Sunday morning, Christian Education staff will be in Fellowship Hall to welcome students in preschool through Grade 12. Classes will be in session from 9:30-10:15.

The Adult Forum is being repurposed for Adult Christian Education. Parents (as adults) are encouraged to participate and demonstrate that being a disciple of Jesus Christ is a lifelong process. Families will then be able to worship together at 10:30 a.m.

Worship-time childcare will continue to be available for infants and children up through Grade 2. Following worship, the *entire* community may participate together in fellowship at 11:30 a.m.

Sunday morning Adult Christian Education will focus upon the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 5-7. There is no need to prepare for the first meeting on January 6, though we will be reading this together, including series of “blessed” statements, known as the Beatitudes (“blessed are the peacemakers...”).

Another opportunity for adults to model discipleship is to participate in the Adult Bible Study on Wednesday mornings. This fall we have looked at an overview of the Old Testament and concluded with a four week study on the minor prophet Jonah. We will begin again on January 9 at 10:00 a.m. for a four week study on the Doctrine of Election (*this includes the topic of predestination*). We will continue on January 16, 23, and 30.

If you are interested in an evening or weekend Bible Study – if Wednesday mornings do not fit your schedule – please contact pastor@overbrookpresb.org. Please indicate which day /time works better for you.


There are other exciting milestones at Overbrook. As mentioned in the bulletins and electronic announcements, your Session

Howard is president of the Karitas Foundation that has led mission trips to Mexico, Nicaragua, Haiti, Jamaica and India and sponsors community-based empowerment-focused projects in several countries, a focus in Mexico. He calls himself a contemplative activist. Howard has written two books and many articles.


I will take notes during our conversations, gathering and then summarizing what you share, then preparing a report for the church's leadership. Copies of that report will be available upon request.


