Mission and Outreach (Cont'd)

Our church is in need of some prayers, as we move through this transition. We ask that you pray for the health of our church and all of its members. The Presbytery will need our support and prayers, as we are guided through this process. Session is in need of your prayers as they consider the options for the future, and please pray for the Gillettes, as they search for their next call.

Our friends at the Village have asked us to support them with backpacks filled with school supplies. This allows the children to arrive at school ready to learn. We will have several ways for you to help. You can shop for a child, collect supplies, or donate money. We will have lists of the items needed. Watch for more information in the coming weeks. Read below on an article from Nancy Gilhool on our bookbag collection.

School has just ended, and it's time to think about September. Why? Because filled bookbags are needed for clients of the Village to use when school begins again. As we have done in previous years, we ask your generosity in donating school supplies to fill at least 30 bookbags for the children receiving services at the Village. Beginning on Sunday, July 1, at the Mission Table in coffee hour there will be lists of items that are needed. Don't want to shop? Then buy from our supplies or give a donation to cover costs. (Hint: if you want to shop, you may want to wait for the super sales at Staples, Target, etc.) All filled bookbags are due at the Village by August 13. Remember, school is much more fun when you have the supplies you need. Please direct questions to Nancy Gilhool, gilhoolfam@verizon.net.

We will also be collecting items for Comfort Cases. Many foster children move from place to place with their belongings in a trash bag. We want to give the children a dignified way to carry their things and provide the children with some toiletries, a blanket, a book and a stuffed animal to call their own. We have 40 duffel bags that we will fill and donate. The already strained foster care system is overflowing with immigrant children who have arrived with nothing. Let's give them some comfort until they can be reunited with their parents.

The Women's Dining Circle raised funds for our youth to go on a mission to West Virginia in August. There is a need for additional funds to support the chaperones, travel expenses, and the overall cost of the mission work. Watch for upcoming fundraising activities for the Youth Mission trip. Congregational Life



Dear friends at Overbrook:




