As you discern your yearly commitment, I want to take a moment to highlight the incredible generosity of this church for this past year. As we look ahead, it is right and good to be proud of what we have accomplished *as the church*.

- *We, as the church*, have raised \$90,000 for our emergency fund. These gifts have subsidized housing payments, bought food and medication, and supplied transportation to those in need. These gifts have alleviated anxiety, saved people from possible eviction, and have provided a lifeline in an insecure moment.
- *We, as the church*, have supplemented the compensation of our soloists and preschool teacher with an extra \$29,000 to secure them in a difficult moment. These leaders in our church were supported and cared for by this church when the world turned upside down.
- *We, as the church*, have invested \$25,000 in new audio and live-streaming technology to serve our community and their needs better. We are now in a better place to provide worship opportunities to our community, both near and far. Our outreach can now continue to grow.
- *We, as the church*, have invested over \$65,000 to maintain the historic beauty of the building. The building will continue to serve as a beacon of goodness in our neighborhood.
- *We, as the church*, have invested \$7,500 with the United Bank of Philadelphia, the only black-owned bank in Philadelphia, so that they can continue to provide vital banking services to historically underrepresented groups in the city.
- *We, as the church*, continue to exceed our giving forecasts for 2020. The boldness with which you all give is uncommon in this world.

## Support during these difficult times

### Prayer and Care Team Invitations

The Prayer and Care team invites you to allow us...

...to serve you! If you are in need of food assistance during these challenging times, due to medical precautions or financial need, please know that we will gladly deliver Prayer and Care groceries to your home. Each bag contains meal support for 3-4 days and includes fresh produce, meat and dairy products, as well as canned and packaged foods. Deliveries can be scheduled weekly, twice a month, or occasionally, as needed. For those who prefer to make their own food selections, grocery cards can be provided. Doorstep deliveries are made each Thursday, between 1:15-2:30 PM. Since March, approximately 280 household deliveries of groceries, and shopping cards have been prayerfully made...each a gift, freely given. The Prayer and Care ministry is supported by the Emergency Fund.

...to welcome you! If you are looking for an area of personal ministry during this time of separation, please know that the Prayer and Care Team welcomes you to serve with us! Following CDC guidelines, we offer independent, or small cluster (2-3 persons) volunteer opportunities. Independent opportunities include: telephone scheduling, driving, shopping, and offering prayer for our recipients and volunteers.. Small clusters of volunteers stock the kitchen each Tuesday and pack the bags on Thursday.

If you would like to receive a delivery, or make a delivery possible for others, please contact Sharon Parker (sparker614@gmail.com; home:267-292-5628). Currently, the Prayer and Care Team is welcoming contributions of garden produce and reusable market bags. If you have bags or produce to share with us, please contact Sharon (sparker614@gmail.com) or Karen Wong (testawong@gmail.com), and we'll be happy to arrange for pick-up.

### A call to Advent from the Worship & Music Committee

Everyone who has ever participated in Advent at Overbrook Presbyterian Church knows that this sacred season of anticipating and waiting for the birth of Jesus is an extraordinary time here. Although life is very different in this season of the coronavirus, Advent for Overbrook will not be diminished. The goal of the Worship and Music Committee is to provide for all members of the Overbrook community an Advent experience that is as rich and fulfilling as the Advents we have loved in the past. The challenge is to plan Advent in such a way that we can all be **together—separately**.

#### *Together but separately?*

Please mark your calendar:

- \* Sunday, November 29, Advent I - The first candle on the Advent Wreath, the candle of hope, will be lighted.
- \* Sunday, December 6, Advent II - Messiah Sing! The second candle on the Advent Wreath, the candle of peace, will be lighted.
- \* Sunday, December 13, Advent III - The Greening of our homes. The third candle on the Advent Wreath, the candle of joy, will be lighted.
- \* Sunday, December 20, Advent IV - The fourth candle on the Advent Wreath, the candle of love, will be lighted.
- \* Thursday, December 24, Christmas Eve - Lessons and Carols at 9:00 p.m. The Christ candle on the Advent Wreath will be lighted. (Don't forget to check out Christian Ed's plans for the younger set earlier in the day.)

How can we do all these things **together while separate**? The Worship and Music Committee is assembling **Advent Bags** for every household that participates in the work of Overbrook—members, regular attenders, friends. Each Advent bag will hold all the “stuff” you need to do in your home separately what we otherwise would have done in church together.



Your bag will contain :

- An Advent Devotional for your use during the entire month of Advent.
- An Advent wreath frame with four candles and instructions to assemble the Advent wreath. There will also be an explanation of the many greens and herbs we use to decorate Advent wreaths which you may choose to use, or not, to assemble your wreath. Then, when we light each Advent candle during worship, you can light yours at home as well. **Together but separately.**
- A kit with all the materials to make four Chrismons. Chrismon means Christ's monogram, and Chrismons are Christmas ornaments that are symbols of Christ and are made with gold and white materials. There will be detailed instructions on how to make Chrismons and basic materials to make them. The four Chrismon patterns you will receive are the anchor representing hope, the dove representing peace, the cross representing joy, and the heart representing love. These correspond with the four Sundays of Advent. On the third Sunday of Advent when we “Green our homes,” you can add the Chrismons to your tree. Greening our homes will be a little different from the Service for the Hanging of the Greens which we did last year, but we all have been decorating our homes for Christmas much longer than we have been decorating our church. We can do this.
- Finally, the Advent bag will have one vigil candle. (I just learned that the white candle we light and hold in the darkness of the sanctuary when we sing Silent Night on Christmas Eve is called a vigil candle.) Light the vigil candle during the service of Lessons and Carols on Christmas Eve.

Yes, together but separately.

## Worship and Music (Cont'd)

### *Together and together! A Live Nativity!*



Peter Seidel, Max Mason, and Mimi Winkler have designed and will lead the construction of a new Nativity Scene for Overbrook which will be set up in the parking lot. Materials to build the stable are on site. Max Mason will oversee the design and construction of the Nativity figures which will be present in the stable throughout Advent. Then, on Christmas Eve Day, from noon until 6:00 p.m., the life-like figures created by Max will step aside to permit real life people and animals to fill the stable.

Weather and coronavirus permitting, visitors will be able to view the Nativity Scene with the live animals which probably will not object to being petted or posing for pictures.

We recognize that we all have a need to be together. We believe this opportunity will permit those of us who are able to see each other—**masked and socially distanced and outside**—on Christmas Eve.

**PLEASE WATCH FOR** other announcements about Advent and Christmas. Christian Ed will separately address their plans. The Congregational Life Committee will address the making of gingerbread houses.

## Christian Education

### What's happening in CE?

The Christian Education Committee continues its work to support and engage all ages of children and youth at Overbrook! It's hard to believe that we will soon be into Advent and Christmas events, but before that, let's consider November...

- *For our elementary school students:*  
Sunday School is scheduled for November 8<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup>, immediately following worship. November's lessons will be about giving thanks, in preparation for Thanksgiving.  
*\*We are working to schedule an in-person food packing event with Kids Against Hunger for elementary students & their families in November. Stay tuned!*
- *For middle and high school students:*  
**\*NEW:** all MS & HS students are invited to come together to pack food for Kids Against Hunger in Broomall on November 10, 6-8pm. Mark your calendar and watch for an email with the details. Otherwise, youth group will continue in November with middle school students meeting on November 17 and middle & high school students coming together to meet on November 24.

As we consider some in-person events, we will need to maintain appropriate adult-child ratios (while also taking temperatures and keeping our physical distance from each other). If you are interested in helping with any future CE events, you will need to have current child clearances on file with the church. It's pretty easy to do and they last for years! The CE Committee, in coordination with Worship & Music, will be preparing some items for your family to prepare for the birth of our Savior. Contents of these Advent bags have not been confirmed but you won't want to miss out.



The Christmas Pageant will go on, on Zoom! As always, it will be during the Family Service at 5pm on December 24. We will have rehearsals during Sunday School on December 13 and 20 at noon. More information and sign-ups will be made available in mid-November.

## Giving for 2021

*The Future

You should have received by now, via US Mail, your appeal for the 2021 OPC annual fund drive. We are asking that you mail in your estimate of annual giving card and then join us on the Zoom worship service on November 8 as we bless our gifts and generosity.

Two new slight twists this year. First, there will be no more “asks” for the OPC operating budget for the rest of the year. This is it.

Second, please consider automating your gifts straight from your bank account to the church. Direct deposits at regularly scheduled intervals makes giving easier for everyone. More information on how to do this can be found of the OPC website.

## Finance

The Committee has been busy the last two months revising our 2020 budget so that we can support the priorities of the church, while balancing fiscal responsibility. As Adam’s recent message to the church communicated, the church is expecting to run a deficit of \$136,000 for 2020. This deficit will be met with a draw from our endowment. The deficit can be primarily attributed to three factors: 1) the loss of rental revenue, 2) property needs, and 3) personnel support. We are grateful for the continued generosity of the church, which has reduced the amount that we will withdraw from our savings this year, while allowing us to invest in the church property, church staff, and the community.

Finance and Property Committee members will be available to answer your questions about the revised budget on *November 8 at 9:30am*. Please join us if you are interested in further details. A zoom link will be emailed out to the congregation prior to the meeting.

The Finance Committee is also pleased to share that we have invested in a \$7500 CD at United Bank of Philadelphia, one of 42 black-owned financial institutions in America, and the only black-owned bank in Philadelphia. The United Bank has remained open during the pandemic providing banking services, PPP loans and other support to business and individuals in Philadelphia, with a special sensitivity to Blacks, Hispanics, Asians and women. Overbrook and United Bank share a similar mission, and we look forward to working together to positively impact our community. A special thanks to Trudy Sheau and Will Schick for agreeing to be our signers!

As always, we are thankful to everyone for their kindness and generosity, and for the financial support we are receiving for the mission and ministry of Overbrook Church.

## OPC Emergency Fund

### OPC Covid-19 Emergency Fund: an opportunity for ministry

In March, as the OPC Prayer and Care Team began making grocery deliveries to OPC members at high risk for Covid-19, it wasn't envisioned that the pandemic would still be part of our lives 296 grocery deliveries and 7 months later. In April, when the OPC Covid-19 Emergency Fund was initiated, the scope and duration of emerging need could not have been anticipated. Both initiatives were leaps of faith; both efforts began working collaboratively to address the needs of the families of Overbrook.

The generosity of our congregation has been abundant. We are blessed to have received donations totaling \$90,888.20. To date, \$46,803.26 has been dispersed to defray the costs of housing, medical expenses, food, and transportation for members of our Overbrook family. Recent disbursements have been approximately \$7,000 per month. Last month, when it appeared as though the Emergency Fund was facing depletion, we prayed that God would help us find a way to continue this ministry. Those prayers were answered; numerous donations were forthcoming.

In establishing the Covid-19 Emergency Fund and the Prayer and Care food ministry, leaps of faith were taken, and prayers have continued to be answered. We remain grateful to God and to generous OPC contributors for every gift received. Each contribution has been a blessing to those in need. Please join us as we pray that this ministry, and those whom it serves, will be sustained.

May God guide us as we support the Emergency Fund and the Prayer and Care Food Ministry. 

The other page is simply "Overbrook Presbyterian Church". This is the Official and public church page that announces church events, activities, and services. This page is what potential visitors will see when they check us out on the internet. We encourage all OPC members and friends to "like" the public facing Overbrook page. Be sure you're looking at the Overbrook Presbyterian Church page for the one in Philadelphia, not the ones in Richmond, Gaffney, or Columbus.
