This past weekend, OPC held its Vision Summit to discern the shape of our future work. We had a fantastic turnout. On Friday night, a large group from the church participated in brainstorming exercises to help unearth the communities mission and goals. The following day, the elders, deacons, and staff brainstormed and created a draft of the church's mission statement, core values, and three-year goals.

During our initial conversation on Friday, I felt equal parts exhilaration and fear. It was exhilarating to hear the broad and beautiful visions for this church. The palpable sense in the room was that people LOVE this church. That love is vital for the continual stewardship of the community. I was also afraid because the ideas were so broad and generous that I was unsure how we could accomplish the many visions being presented.

I woke up very early on Saturday morning replaying the conversations of Friday night in my head. Truthfully, at about 4am my anxiety got the better of me. A part of me wanted to just cast the vision myself, without the aid of the congregation. You know how it is, terrible ideas seem attractive early in the morning when you can't sleep. Eventually, the Holy Spirit talked me out of my bad idea and reminded me that the strength of this church is its love in the midst of its diversity. Our unique power is that we all don't think alike, but we all love the church. We will find our way not because the vision is the product of one person, but because we have so many people who care about the direction of the church. We will make it to our goals, because we will travel together.

As for our goals, after two long conversations, we rest. The Vision Summit moved quickly, which was valuable, but now we lay fallow. After a bit of time and a little distance, the elders, deacons, and staff will once again gather to provide a final shape to these documents. We have made great strides in the past few days. Now we pray, we listen, we think, and we let the Holy Spirit shape us into the church we are becoming. May God bless us in this season, and may the way become clear for us all.

OPC Hardscape Project


In case the word is new to you, Wikipedia tells us “Hardscape refers to hard landscape materials in the built environment structures that are incorporated into a landscape. This can include paved areas, driveways, retaining walls, sleeper walls, stairs, walkways, and any other landscaping made up of hard-wearing materials such as wood, stone, and concrete, as opposed to softscape, the horticultural elements of a landscape.”

Earlier this year in March, OPC was “awarded” \$75,000 by the PA Commission on Crime and Delinquency, a 75% match for a hardscape project developed to improve the perimeter security of our church. There are three aspects:

- providing a protective wall around the OPK playground;
- make repairs to existing perimeter site walls along Lancaster and City Avenues; and
- plant shrubbery between the playground and Lancaster Ave. for improved visual security.

The major effort will be to replace the existing three-foot-high chain link fence surrounding the OPK playground with a 20-inch-high stone and concrete wall, topped by a 3-ft high black aluminum fence. The two gates to the playground will be replaced with appropriate black aluminum designs.

Our first proposal for a new fence was provided by Rusticraft who recently provided OPC with a wooden fence surrounding the rain garden near City Avenue.



While the context and fence details are not exact, the picture to the left provides a vision of the new low wall and fence that are being planned. The actual funding will not be provided by the state until the contracts are agreed and the initial payments are made. We are working on the timing for the project at this time. Wish us luck!

New Gas-fired Boiler

Since about 1975 the offices, Wistar Morris room, and the rooms above it have been heated by a small oil-fired boiler separate from the main heating system of the church. This arrangement allows those areas to be heated without turning on heat in the whole church.

Our heating maintenance company, Sebastian, has replaced that boiler with a new gas-fired boiler which connects to the existing gas main. The 4000 gallon underground oil tank supplying oil to the old boiler has been removed from the lawn area near the office entrance, which will make room for the installation of a wheelchair ramp from ground level up to the office entrance.


